The personal home of Laszlo Fazekas, chief executive officer of Miami Lakes-based LF Construction & Development LLC, was listed for sale in late August for \$4.495 million.

The 7,063-square-foot contemporary estate, which was formerly occupied by former Florida governor and U.S. Sen. Bob Graham, has some features not often found in South Florida, not to mention its own custom six-hole miniature golf course, lighted hardcourt tennis/basketball court and a motor court with room for up to 14 vehicles.

"The owner used finishes in this house that rival a \$20 million house he built on Palm Island," said Luis Dominguez, a director of luxury sales at Douglas Elliman Real Estate in Coral Gables, who holds the listing along with Compass Florida agent Karl Hueck. "You don't see these finishes anywhere else. It's a standout property."

The one-story, five-bedroom, six-bath home, located at 16121 Aberdeen Way, is in Miami Lakes, a town that was incorporated in December 2000, which makes it one of the youngest municipalities in Miami-Dade County.
